Seven-Year-Olds

- In contrast with brash, noisy sixes, seven-year-olds are generally quiet, sensitive, and serious. Their intense moods often change quickly. Tend to work hard at everything they do and need private time to manage their new thoughts and feelings.

Eight-Year-Olds

- Enthusiastic and imaginative, eights often love big challenges but lack the work skills and patience to complete their plans. Children this age need adult help to know their limits and work through the steps to reach a goal.

Nine-Year Olds

- Enthusiasm may turn into brooding and worrying at nine. Nines tend to be critical of the world around them. Nothing seems fair to a nine-year-old, but nine can also be a time of budding intellectual curiosity. Children this age look hard for explanations of how things work and why they happen.

Ten-Year-Olds

- They are generally happy enjoying themselves and their peers, parents, and siblings. They are proud of their accomplishments.
